Early Birds

Early Birds is the morning tutoring/enrichment time. There is a maximum number of 30 spots available.

Forms were sent home and need to be returned.

Your child has to be enrolled in SCORE for attendance purposes-NO DEPOSIT NEEDED.

Drop off will be at the WEST CAMPUS at 7:35. Your child will be placed in their group and complete the activities.

They will receive a grab and go breakfast if you want them to have breakfast from the main building when they are dismissed at 8:05 to go to their homeroom.

January 2020 will see a slight change and notices will be sent out of where drop off will be for both buildings and the times.



ART Information:

Mr. Berning is the after school ART teacher.

ART is in two sessions. The first session is reserved for those students who are coming to SCORE on ART days only. The second session is for those students who attend SCORE along with ART. The session times are 3:45-4:30 and 4:35-5:30.

ART days are as follows:

Monday 5th grade

2nd session is Kindergarten

Tuesday-4th grade

Wednesday-3rd grade

Thursday-2nd grade

Friday-1st grade

Students are expected to attend on their assigned nights. Mr. Berning has projects that are completed in multiple stages, so attendance is required to complete them.




Student Responsibility

1. Attend and participate in all activities to the best of their ability.
2. Respect the staff and other students involved with the S.C.O.R.E. program.
3. Listen and follow all directions.

Parent Responsibility

1. Encourage your child to make him/her the best that they can be.
2. Notify one of the coordinators if there is a problem.
3. Make sure students are picked up by 5:35 each evening. If your child is picked up later than 5:35, there will be an additional charge for the day **(for every minute late after 5:35, a \$1 fee will be billed per minute)**

4. Adhere to the terms of the discipline policy as stated in the handbook.
5. Check and make sure your child's homework is signed.
6. To clarify the billing policy, students that have a bill that is **past due** 45 days will not be able to attend any of the programs offered until the **full balance of the entire bill** is paid.
7. In addition, students that have an outstanding bill at the end of the school year will not be able to attend S.C.O.R.E. the following school year until the bill is paid and cleared. (This includes after school art, choir, and any other programs offered by the after school program).
8. It is your responsibility to make sure your child knows the days they are to attend S.C.O.R.E. You may call the S.C.O.R.E. phone at 872-7670 and leave a message or email Mrs. Armstrong (larmstrong@usd466.org) with any changes in your plans.

9. It is also your responsibility to let the person know who is picking your child up (if it is not you) the PIN number to check them out. This is a new check out system in 2017 and it is implemented for your child's safety. The staff will not tell the person picking up your child the PIN number!
10. If any student leaves the school grounds and/or conducts inappropriate behaviors between leaving their classroom and checking into S.C.O.R.E., he or she will receive consequences as stated in the school and district handbooks.
11. Please notify the S.C.O.R.E. staff when contact information changes. **There has to be a current phone number on file in case of emergency.**
12. When a student has signed up for the Saturday projects, expected their day/days.  greenhouse/art they are to be there on assigned



PROGRAM RESPONSIBILITY

1. Provide a positive and safe environment for students.
2. Provide homework help
3. Serve appropriate snacks
4. Provide academic enrichment activities that help support the school curriculum.
5. Provide a physical activity to help encourage healthy life styles for our students.
6. To use community resources and volunteers to increase knowledge of our community and surroundings to our students.

S.C.O.R.E. will not be in session when

1. There is early dismissal due to weather.

2. Early dismissal due to school calendar events.
3. Vacation days set by the school calendar.
4. School is closed due to weather.



Expectations

1. Follow directions
2. Respect others and property
3. Share and work together
4. Snacks and drinks from home may not be brought-this includes lunch food left over.

Discipline Procedures:

1. S.C.O.R.E. staff will talk with student about the behavior.
2. Age appropriate time-out. Boys Town Model will also be used with students.
3. Depending on the behavior, there may be other consequences. Examples: not participating in the planned activity or



having to call or tell the parent what happened when they arrive.

If behaviors do not improve or a more severe behavior happens then:

4. An incident report will be filled out and the coordinator will talk with the parent
5. One or both of the coordinators will conference with the parent a second time.
6. Suspension from the program for 2-5 days depending on the situation.

Continued behavior problems may result in the student no longer being able to participate in the program.

S.C.O.R.E. students and staff are to adhere to all policies and procedures in the SCES

Handbook as well as the S.C.O.R.E. handbook.

S.C.O.R.E. Fee System

All S.C.O.R.E. students will be required to have a deposit (which started in 2015-2016). Outstanding bills will be paid from the deposit and students may return to the S.C.O.R.E. program when the deposit is replenished.



The deposit amount for each student is based on a lunch status sliding scale:
Full pay=\$80



Reduced lunch=\$40

Free lunch=\$20

Deposits will be returned when a student transfers to the 6th grade or moves out of district.

Students that check in at 3:35 will be charged the daily rate of:

\$1 per day=free lunch

\$2 per day=reduced lunch

\$4 per day=full pay lunch

The following activities are available to students free of charge:

3rd, 4th and 5th Grade Choir (meets on Thursday from 3:35-4:35) No deposit needed. ***If pickup is late, you will be charged \$1 per minute past 4:35.***

Go Far in the spring has a fee of \$20 to participate. No deposit needed. **If your child**



attends SCORE after Go Far, the daily rate will be charged.

Tutoring assigned by a teacher. Monday-Thursday after school from 3:35-4:35.

Snack Club (new for 2019) Any student is able to come to snack club with no charge. Students will be expected to stay in the cafeteria to finish their snack then leave the building by 3:55.
